

Invoicing process with the eBill invoicing service



The eBill invoicing service couldn't be simpler

1. As the biller, you share your invoicing data digitally with our network partner Avaloq Outline AG – you conclude a corresponding agreement with Avaloq Outline AG in advance.
2. Avaloq Outline AG uses your invoicing data to prepare eBills, which it sends to the eBill portal via the bank infrastructure operator SIX. There are several additional delivery channels available for customers who are not yet using eBill, such as post and email.
3. Your customers can use the online and mobile banking system of their financial institution to access the eBill portal, check their eBills, and authorize payment.
4. The bill amount will be credited to your bank account and you will receive a notification from Credit Suisse as usual.
